## *Our Commitments*

Our commitment for next week is to be on time.

This means more than just being at school by 8:35am and moving quickly and quietly to class. Good time management is an important aspect of being successful. For our students they need to know when their assignments are due to be handed in. A good idea is 3 days before the due date for your children to show you their assignments, this way you can check if they have finished, or need to work hard to get the assignment finished by the due date. From time-to-time students may not have finished all the expected work during class time, when this happens in the last period of the day, your child will likely be required to stay behind 5-10 minutes to complete the work to a standard expected at Otahuhu College.

## Engagement Grade Reports

This Friday, Parents/caregivers should receive, via email, the first of our Fortnightly Engagement Reports. These reports indicate how the student is progressing for that period of time in each particular subject and their attendance in that subject. Students are graded on a scale of 1 to 5 using the criteria below:


5	<b>Exceptionally Engaged</b>	Attempts all classwork and homework, and consistently strives to produce work at or above the level expected from this pupil as indicated by past academic records and target grades/levels. Work consistently demonstrates some sign of individual research or thinking. Always participates in class discussions, consistently volunteering to answer questions. Shows a very positive interest in the lesson. Overall behaviour excellent.
4	<b>Engaged</b>	Attempts all classwork and homework, often striving to produce work at or above the level expected from this pupil as indicated by past academic. Work also occasionally demonstrates some sign of individual research or thinking. Participates freely in class discussions, frequently volunteering to answer questions. Shows positive interest in the lesson. Overall behaviour very good.
3	<b>Acceptable Standard</b>	Attempts classwork and homework, producing work to the level expected from this pupil as indicated by past academic records. Participates in class discussions when asked a direct question, but rarely volunteers answers. Shows a reasonable interest in the lesson. Overall behaviour is good.
1-2	<b>Not Engaged</b>	Frequently requires pressure from staff to work at expected effort levels. Independently attempts too few classwork and homework tasks, or produces work below the level expected from this pupil as indicated by previous academic performance indicators or target grades. Work may show lack of interest, is rushed and is frequently incomplete. Work demonstrates no individual research or thinking and is often poorly presented. Rarely participates in class discussion. Shows little interest in the lesson. Behaviour may be unacceptable.
